REFLECTION

Welcome to the Transitional Cathedral, the broad tent with a wide open door. If you are joining us from beyond Christchurch I trust you are enjoying your stay here. May Christ's star in heaven bring you to humility and worship and enable you to see the presence of God in this beautiful world in which we live.

Today there is to be a baptism in the 10:00am Eucharist. We will welcome George Holm to be baptised and made a member of the Body of Christ, the Church. We have just completed the season of Christmas, and one of the central readings of Christmas Day, John 1:1-14, declares that all who receive Jesus and who believe in his name, are given power to become children of God. Today, through the sacrament of Baptism, George will become a child of God, an heir of the promises of God made ages before to Abraham and Sarah, and to the prophets down through the ages. Today George becomes a child of God, and we give hearty thanks and praise that the gift of Jesus, who came from heaven to dwell among us, has opened the way for us all to be children of God.

The Anglican Church of Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia is mourning the death of one of our Archbishops. Archbishop Brown Turei, was Archbishop of the Maori Tikanga of our Church when he died early last week surrounded by his family. He was 92 years old. He had been a bishop since 1992, and was in the process of retiring from his episcopal roles. We are all asked to pray for Archbishop Brown's beloved wife Mihi, their children, grandchildren, extended whanau, and for the people of his Diocese (Tairāwhiti – the East Coast of the North Island of New Zealand). There is also a call for prayer for the ordination of a new bishop for our Church. Bishop Elect, Archdeacon Richard Wallace, is to be ordained Bishop this Saturday 21 January at Onuku Marae in Akaroa at 10:00am. His installation as Bishop of Te Waipounamu (the South Island of New Zealand, Stewart Island, and the Chatham Islands) will take place next Sunday, 22 January, at 10:30am at 290 Ferry Road, Christchurch.

Last Sunday the Cathedral celebrated the last part of the Christmas story with the arrival of the Magi with their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. On Monday the Church jumped forward several years in the life of Jesus to celebrate his baptism (Jesus was baptised as an adult by his cousin, John the Baptist). Now each Sunday we begin again to rehearse the story of Jesus' life, teaching and ministry and we begin hearing the early accounts of the beginnings in Galilee. In the meantime, however, the Church does not entirely forget about the infancy of Jesus. Luke's gospel tells us that 40 days after his birth he was presented in the temple in accordance with the religious laws of the time (the Law of Moses). You can read about his presentation in Luke 2:22-38. The current tradition in this Cathedral is to keep the crib scene in place for that 40 day period until we have a celebration of Jesus' presentation in the temple. That is a special feast day known as Candlemas and the Cathedral will be keeping this on Sunday 29 January.
