Offering envelopes for 2017-2018 are now available for collection from Deacon Nicky Lee's office.

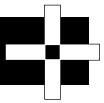

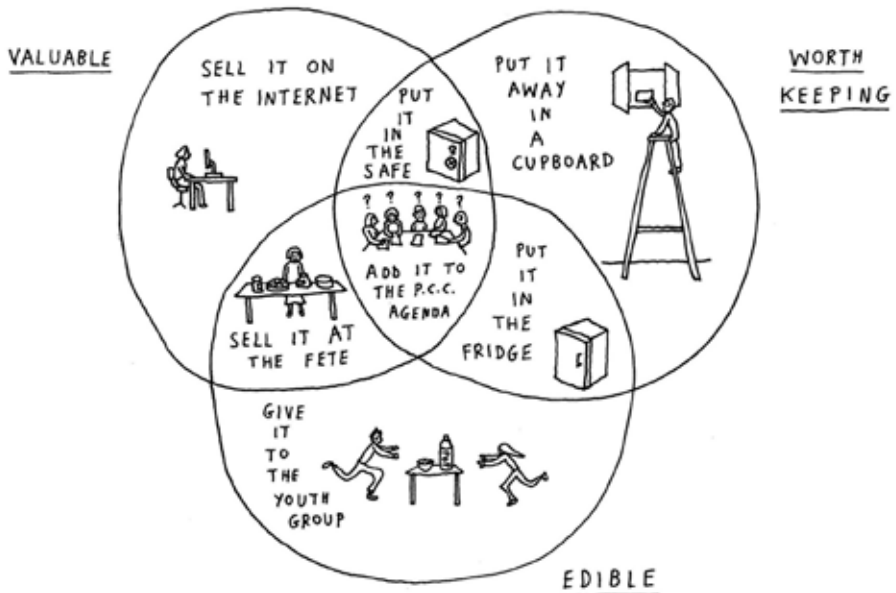

REFLECTION

Welcome to the Transitional Cathedral, the broad tent with a wide-open door. If you are joining us from beyond Christchurch I trust you are enjoying your stay here.

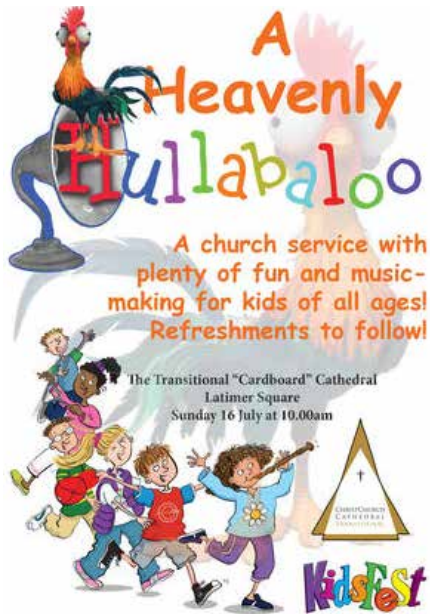
Many parts of the Church at present are focusing their prayer on those who are refugees in the world. Last year, the number of refugees, asylum-seekers and internally displaced people around the world topped 65 million, according to the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees. In 2016, this represented an increase of the number of refugees of nearly 10% (the number was 59.5 million in 2015). This represents immense human suffering; one in every 113 people on earth driven from their homes by persecution, conflict, violence or human rights violations.

The humanitarian crises that are giving rise to large numbers of refugees include ongoing violence in northern Nigeria, and conflicts in Columbia, Somalia, Syria and Afghanistan. Refugees are being hosted in developing countries such as Lebanon (hosting 1 million people) and Turkey (hosting 2.5 million people). More than half of the world's refugees are children.

Over the school holidays there will be a prayer station in the Transitional Cathedral, inviting people to pray for refugees. The prayer station will include a ration box showing the amount of food provided in refugee camps to feed one person for five days. There will also be an invitation to donate to Christian World Service's Operation Refugee appeal. As we pray, recall that the holy family (Mary, Joseph and Jesus) were themselves refugees fleeing the violence of King Herod. Ask God to end all forms of violence and establish a lasting and secure peace on earth for all people everywhere. Pray also for refugees received into this country, that they may find a place of welcome here, and a secure future for their families.

May God bless you all this week.
